


Celebrating the Centenary of the Fleet Air Arm



Guest Speaker Michael Portillo

The Guest Speaker will be the journalist and broadcaster, Michael Portillo, well known for his Great British and International Railway Journeys documentary series. Michael, who was a former Member of Parliament and Secretary of State for Defence in the mid-nineties, is a highly entertaining and engaging speaker. His personal experience of the work of the Defence Council and wealth of knowledge of military history and heritage is inimitable, and his speech in such an apt historic setting will be a highlight of the evening.

The OWO has a rich and storied history and as Churchill's War Office during WW2 and the work place of some of the most important Defence Chiefs and political leaders of the past Century, it could not be a more fitting setting in which to mark the Centenary of the Fleet Air Arm. Throughout two World Wars and the Cold War the lights stayed on in the War Office, shaping history.

By the very nature of its operations, the War Office was also a place of secrecy, espionage and intrigue with strong links to MI5 and MI6. Indeed, Ian Fleming, personal assistant to the Director of Naval Intelligence and creator of James Bond, would have been a frequent visitor during WW2. His boss was an inspiration for 'M' and the building would later feature in five James Bond films including *Skyfall* and *Licence to Kill*.
